### Data snapshot

Victorian education outcomes - NAPLAN 2024







Victoria's NAPLAN participation rate this year was the highest it has been since the first year of testing in 2008.



#### Victorian Year 3 Students

Victorian Year 3 students continue to lead the nation in reading and numeracy – the third year in a row in which this has been achieved.



#### Reading Performance

Victorian students in Years 3, 7 and 9 **improved on their 2023 reading results**, reversing the national trend, which saw the average score for reading decline in Years 3, 5 and 7 and improve only at Year 9.

Victoria's reading performance **improved overall in 2024**, with 5, 000 more students reaching the 'exceeding' proficiency level for reading across all year levels compared to 2023.



#### Victorian Primary School Students

Victorian primary school students continue to produce the best results in the country, ranking first or second in 8 out of 10 domains – more than any other state or territory.



#### **Reading and Writing**

Victoria achieved the first or second highest mean scores of all jurisdictions in 7 out of 8 measures in reading and writing and achieved the top results in the country for writing in Years 5.7 and 9.



There is work to be done to improve outcomes for disadvantaged students, Aboriginal students, and students outside metropolitan areas. Victorian students in these cohorts achieved stronger learning outcomes than in other states and territories, but there are still significant gaps to close. We also need to lift outcomes for our secondary students.

### We Want Our Parents/ Caregivers/Guardians to Tell Us What They Think!

Don't forget that the 2024 Parent/Caregiver/Guardian opinion survey is closing soon on Friday 30th of August. The Parent/Caregiver/ Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. If you are one of the 130 Community Members selected to complete the survey, we would appreciate you finding the time to complete the survey.

### 2024 Swimming Program

Our swimming program will be held in Weeks 3-4 and Weeks 6-7 in Term 4, with each year level experiencing an 8-day block of the swimming program.

We encourage all students to access the swimming program, noting that it is an essential skill for every child to learn to swim and to be water-safe in and around water. With the warmer weather just around the corner we need to be confident that our children are competent, confident swimmers. A timetable with your child's session time will be distributed closer to the start of the swimming program once student participation numbers are finalised. Permission Notices and further information will be distributed via XUNO during the final weeks of Term 3.
